

Catholic Perspectives – Dignity

Our Year 7 students are busily enjoying their UNITE camp. The camp is just one part of a multifaceted approach to encircling all our students in our Johnnies Way. Our 'call to be neighbour to all' has been a focus of the camp, and an action we expect our students to bring back to campus. We are also equipping them with skills beyond school, instilling them with the fundamental belief in the worth of every single person. This belief is based on the Catholic Perspective of Human Dignity. As promised, I have copied some of the communication on Catholic Perspectives provided by BCE, which comes with the imprimatur of the Archbishop of Brisbane. This section on Dignity can also be found on the College Website.



Human Dignity: The Catholic perspective promotes human dignity, the essential worth or dignity of the human person as made in the image and likeness of God. Each human being is unique and unrepeatable and loved and called by God. This means that every human being, in every circumstance, is good. This is not to say that they are morally good. Our moral goodness or moral badness is based on the moral decisions we make. Rather, to affirm the worth or dignity of the human person is to affirm that it is a good thing that he or she exists, that his or her existence is desired by God and that his or her existence is worthwhile. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2013). Catholic thinking about sexuality and relationships is based on this basic affirmation of the equal worth of all human beings.

Speed Reading


This year in the library we have been conducting some great reading lessons with our Year 7 and Year 9 Students. Classes have been coming down and participating in our Speed Dating with Books.

School Procedures

Arriving Late to School

STUDENTS:

- Report to the office with Student ID card.
- Sign In at Student Reception to enter late arrival.
- Students will receive a late slip from office staff.
- Go straight to PC or class.

- Alternatively, parents can provide a written note for students to hand in at the office.
- If students do not sign in at the office or do not have a reason for their late arrival, **Parents will receive an absentee text message.**

Leaving School Early

PARENTS:

- Please write a signed and dated note in your student's diary (Students MUST have a note from parent/ guardian requesting permission for student to leave at a specific time.)
- Parents must collect students from the office.
- Due to safety reasons, we cannot allow students to walk down the hill unaccompanied.
- Parents should drive to the top of the College avoiding break-times:

- **Morning tea: 10.25am-11:10am**
- **Lunch: 12.35pm -1:15pm**

STUDENTS:

- When it is time to leave class, show the note to your class teacher.
- Report to the office to sign out.
- Wait for your parent/guardian to arrive.
