Principal's Message



Dear Johnnies Community,

Thank you to everyone involved in the Parent/Teacher/Student learning conversations last week. Please ensure that you contact Mark O'Connor with any feedback, as we search for the best way to conduct these conversations in a changing environment.

Mark, Brett and I are involved today at the Cluster meeting discussing the impacts of the ACARA review and what that means for our school and the delivery of curriculum. Every time we have a change in curriculum it will create some tension and negativity. The greatest issue for me is that very little consultation occurs with schools, principals and teachers. Decisions are made from an organisational point of view with intellectuals, politicians and theorists who are out of touch with what is needed in schools.

I request your prayers for Sister Catherine Hefferan, a good friend and a spiritual inspiration to me over the past six years. Catherine is very ill with a cancer of the brain and some skeletal areas as well. I will visit Catherine next week and offer what support I can.

NAPLAN is upon us again and I urge you all to encourage your students to approach this seriously. All schools are judged by their overall performance. St. John's is consistently above State and National averages, and we intend to continue this as well as improve it, especially in our numeracy results, which despite good results, have been falling slowly below where we would be satisfied.

Our Maths teachers have been busy preparing our students, and much of the good work around preparation and organisation has been done by John Cathcart, Arlo Goozee and our Maths and English teachers. NAPLAN is important also as

a diagnostic tool for students, to help them improve for their future education.

The Board meeting is scheduled for next Tuesday and prospective members should make contact with me prior to attending a meeting. This week we had to cancel the P&F meeting due to illness of members and families and I look forward to the next meeting on Tuesday 8th June.

Just a quick note to remind parents that as the weather is now cooler, appropriate uniform items need to be worn. The sports jacket is not to be worn with the formal uniform. Boys should be wearing ties and seniors should be wearing their blazers. Students in Year 10 wishing to stay warmer are quite welcome to purchase a blazer. A visit to Marie in the uniform shop will be helpful, as we need to order blazers.

NAPLAN 2021

St John's College will again be participating in NAPLAN Online this year, which commences next week! The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a series of yearly standardised tests which simply assess our students' reading, writing, language and numeracy.

As the testing is now completed in an online format, students must ensure they arrive to school prepared with a **fully charged**

laptop and cable headphones (no wireless headphones, airbuds etc). The test does prompt students with auditory cues so it is important that all students bring earphones.




2021 Bill Turner Cup
