Vocational Education and Training (VET) Pathways

<u>Vocational Education and Training (VET) is that part of education and training which provides accredited training in job related and technical skills to *INDUSTRY*STANDARD.</u>

Vocational Education and Training may be undertaken at school or through a registered training provider (RTO). The qualifications gained from VET are nationally accredited. The skills you gain will also allow you to enter the workforce and/or to move on to further vocational or academic studies. Certificate I to Advanced Diploma qualifications can be completed through VET.

Assessment in VET certificates is competency based. Competency-based assessment is the process of collecting evidence and making judgements on whether the student can consistently demonstrate knowledge and skill and the application of that knowledge and skill to the standard of performance required in the workplace.

VET courses are comprised of units of competency from nationally recognised qualifications under the *Australian Qualifications Framework*. St John's College delivers VET subjects in one of two ways:

- (a) Some courses are offered in partnership with other Registered Training Organisations e.g. TAFE. A partnership arrangement ensures that our students receive the best possible training available enhancing opportunities for further study or work. These subjects are timetabled within the regular school timetable and students attend classes both at the school and in other environments.
- (b) St John's College also makes available opportunities for students to enrol in VET qualifications external to the College e.g. TAFE Qld East Coast, Wynmet, Career Employment Australia, Kawana State College, etc. These courses are not a part of the College timetable, but students may apply to be enrolled in an "External Certificate" class within the College to enable them to complete their work in these courses in those lessons instead of choosing another subject. NB: You CANNOT drop an Elective Subject unless you are enrolled in a Cert IV or higher.

If students undertake VET subjects that generate certificates, their results are recognised as meeting the required national standards by TAFE, some Universities and other training organisations. Studying a VET course can earn students up to 8 credit points towards their QCE (Queensland Certificate of Education).

St John's College offers pathways in a range of trade and vocational training areas for students in Years 11 and 12. The programs are designed to provide students with practical training in their chosen field as well as providing valuable employability skills and opportunities to link with industry. Students develop a range of industry focused skills which prepares them for the workplace or further education and training.

Can I get into University if I have been studying a VET qualification?

A VET Certificate at Level III or higher may be included as part of a student's ATAR. To be eligible for an ATAR, a student must have:

- satisfactorily completed an English subject
- completed five general subjects, or four general subjects plus one applied subject or VET course at AQF certificate III or above
- accumulated their subject results within a five-year period.

Each VET qualification level (certificate III or higher) will have a single scaled score that can be included in a student's ATAR. As an example, a Certificate III in Hospitality and a Certificate III in Laboratory Skills will each have the same scaled score; this will be regardless of the duration or area of study of the certificate III. It is expected that the scaled score for a completed VET diploma will be higher than that for a completed VET certificate IV, which in turn will be higher than the scaled score for a completed VET certificate III. (QTAC/ATAR, 2018). A Certificate III or higher can also be used as a stand-alone Entry Selection Rank for university entry. Currently, competency-based qualifications maximum selection ranks are:

Completed AQF Certificate III Maximum Selection Rank 68.00
 Completed AQF Certificate IV Maximum Selection Rank 74.00
 Completed AQF Diploma Maximum Selection Rank 82.00

NB: Students must consult the entry requirements of all universities being considered because there is a high degree of variance between each institution regarding the inclusion of a VET qualification in the ATAR or as a Stand-alone Entry Qualification. Check QTAC for Uni Prerequisites, Assumed Knowledge & Recommended Study.

There are many pathways for entry to university, TAFE or other learning institutions. The College's Pathways Coordinator can help you understand your alternatives, but students are also encouraged to make their own enquiries with individual tertiary institutions they are interested in attending.

Additional information relating to VET courses.

- Most Certificate I and II Courses ARE FUNDED UNDER VETiS (Vet in Schools) funding by the Qld Government. As such, students can only enrol in ONE VETiS funded course in Year 11 or Year 12. It is important that all students seek advice from the Pathways Coordinator BEFORE enrolling in any VET course. NB: One of these courses can reduce a full-time apprenticeship by up to 6 months.
- Any Certificate level courses undertaken which involve an external RTO may incur
 material and/or tuition fees unless they are fully VETiS funded. These costs are in addition
 to any school fees charged by St John's College.

School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships

School Based Traineeships or Apprenticeships (SATS) can be undertaken during the Senior Phase of Learning. These are endorsed training packages, based on industry standards that

can lead to nationally recognised qualifications under the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF).

School Based Traineeships or Apprenticeships (SATS) are an ideal way for students to gain information and an insight into the world of employment while they are studying for their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). They also allow the opportunity to accumulate up to 8 points towards their QCE for a successfully completed traineeship or partially completed apprenticeship at the end of Year 12.

Students may apply for a School-Based Traineeship or Apprenticeship from Term 4, Year 10 only if this has been identified in the SET Plan as the best pathway for them and it is part of a study program that continues through until the end of Year 12. There is no guarantee that such an activity will be approved by the College – in fact, it is rare that it will be approved in Year 10. Special circumstances will be required to achieve such an approval.

A SAT must impact a student's timetable by attending school 4 days a week with 1 day in Industry. Students on an Electrotechnology (electrical) SAT must work 1 day/week plus an extra day/week to be worked during school holidays (80 paid days/year) on the job and complete a minimum of 4 weeks off the job training per year. (*Please note that for an electrical School Based Apprenticeship a student must have passed English, Maths and Science in Year 10 and it must be approved by ESQ*).

For all SATS, a legally-binding, training contract must be signed by the student, employer (either direct or a group trainer) and an apprenticeship centre to protect the interests of all parties. Students who undertake a SAT must be paid award wages for their age, year level and type of certificate they are studying towards. The wage rate also depends on whether the organisation is a State or Federal registered business.

The good news is that apprenticeships and traineeships are competency based, which means that in most cases, the faster that you can learn and apply new skills, the sooner you can gain your qualification. A vocational certificate is awarded at the end of both the school and on-the-job components.

Any student who chooses to undertake these training options will be expected to catch up any work missed from their school subjects in their own time. For Year 11 and 12 students, this may include the three Access classes which are allocated each week at the College. It is an expectation that students undertaking these options will continue to study six subjects within the College timetable – there will be NO additional "study" or "free" lessons allowed except in cases of documented and proven hardship or extenuating circumstances. Some students may be eligible to apply for participation in an "External Certificate" class when undertaking these traineeships – but acceptance into these classes is based on an application process. Such classes have additional workload, behavioural and completion of assessment requirements attached to them.

Benefits for school students

SATS allow students in Years 11 and 12 to:

- Work as paid employees receiving the Industry Award wage.
- Progress towards completing a nationally recognised qualification.
- Gain up to 8 points on their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).

To qualify a student must:

- Still be attending school.
- Will be undertaking a minimum of 375 hrs (50 days) paid employment (80 paid days for the Electrotechnology & Hospitality Industries) – some of which may be required to be completed on weekends and/or holiday times.
- Undertake some part of the qualification (i.e. either training or work) during normal school hours (A SAT must impact a student's timetable).
- Meet the requirements put in place by St John's College for participating in these activities

 including making satisfactory academic progress in all subjects and demonstrating good
 behaviour and a positive attitude within the College.

As a School-Based Apprentice or Trainee you:

- Can still obtain a Senior Statement and achieve a Selection Rank.
- Will normally work one set day per week (currently Thursdays but this may be Friday subject to negotiation before signing up), with the option of also working after school hours, on weekends or during your school holidays.
- Are expected to catch up any schoolwork which is missed through your absence to undertake this training during school times.

SATs help young people to undertake a variety of pathways for their future ... whether it's a full-time job, a trade career, university, TAFE or other training. The workplace skills and confidence they gain during their SAT provide a solid foundation for any career.

What is the difference between an apprenticeship and a traineeship?

School-Based Apprenticeships are at Certificate III level and traditionally focus on trade-based industries, such as electrical, building and construction, cooking, automotive, hairdressing and engineering. School-Based Apprentices work towards completing their first year of a full-time apprenticeship during their senior years at school. Training is provided either on or off the job by the employer and a Supervising Registered Training Organisation (SRTO).

Most trades will do up to a five (5) week training block at TAFE which will include time out of school. (It is expected that students undertaking these courses catch up any schoolwork which is missed in their own time). Apprenticeships will be converted to full-time apprenticeships post Year 12.

School-Based Traineeships are available at Certificate II level and above and are of between one year and three years in duration. They generally cover all other industries that do not require a trade certificate such as business, retail, hospitality, IT and tourism. The student also needs to complete 375 hours (50 paid days) (80 days for Hospitality) per year of the traineeship as well as successfully complete module booklets or online which are provided by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO).

Traineeships may be completed earlier if all requirements are met by the student, and it is recommended that a School-Based Traineeship be completed prior to graduating in Year 12. Non-completed traineeships will be converted to full time traineeships post Year 12.




